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## A message from the Rector:

Dear Parish Family,

Welcome to our parish Mission Action Plan 2022 (MAP). We have been working towards MAP 2022 for several months and have spent time prayerfully discerning God's will and seeing where the Spirit is leading us as a faith community. ## Vision:


We will be an invitational, welcoming and caring Church.

## Preamble:

The Anglican Parish of Waterloo Bay consists of two community campuses based at St James’ Wellington Point and St George’s Birkdale. The Rectory is situated at Birkdale and therefore much of the church ministry is based on that campus.

The parish has recently engaged in the Pathways Discipleship Program. Pathways begins by identifying the people within the span of influence of our church that we might meaningfully engage. In church planting literature, these people are sometimes referred to as a ‘mission focus group’ – i.e. the people with whom we’ll focus our primary attention in mission. Once we identified our mission focus group, Pathways encouraged us to think about following seven stages that map the journey from being someone who doesn’t know Jesus or his followers, to being a person who’s leading others in mission.

The parish is also committed to the development of a Mission Action Plan – the subject of this document.

# 1. Welcoming

The Anglican Parish of Waterloo Bay is a community that embraces being welcoming and inclusive of people from every background.

Therefore:

***We aim to improve the quality and timeliness of the welcoming of current parishioners and new attendees to worship as well as the associated follow-up care.***

*“Whoever welcomes you welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me.” (Matthew 10.40)*
